The Albert Hall receives financial support from the Cultural Recovery Fund - round 3

Mid Wales' Oldest Theatre, The Albert Hall, has received financial support from Round 3, of the Cultural Recovery Fund.

The Albert Hall, Llandrindod Wells is extremely grateful to the official public body charged with funding and supporting the arts in Wales, Arts Council Wales, for awarding a grant of £4,024, from round 3 of the Cultural Recovery Fund (CRF).

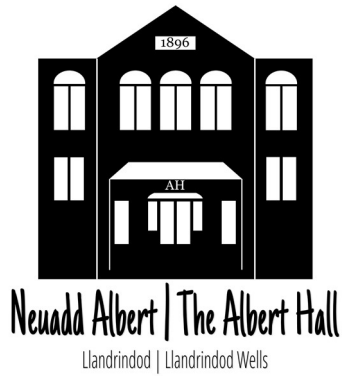
The CRF is a Welsh Government scheme for organisations and individual artists that have been significantly affected by the Covid19 pandemic. £53million was announced for the first round in August 2020 and a further £30million was made available for a second round in April 2021. In early 2022, an additional £4.2m was made available.

The Albert Hall has been successful in round 3, receiving funding for the costs incurred during our winter closure between December and February.

Jon Williams, Chairman of The Albert Hall Management Committee said, "Once again, we must thank Arts Council Wales for including The Albert Hall in the third round of the Cultural Recovery Fund. This funding has ensured, we can keep focussed on our upcoming essential maintenance, rather than having to first pay out for the expenses incurred, whilst we were unable to open between December and February."
